<p><b>Short presentation</b></p>	<p>Organizația Studenților în Drept(OSD) was founded in 2018 with the goal of representing BBU's Law students and helping them integrate in the social and cultural life of Cluj-Napoca. Currently, we have over 300 members who organise projects such as conferences, quizzes, internships, Moot Court competitions etc. for and with Law students twice or thrice a week. We form a close-knit community (which we like to call the "second family") in which each generation passes on the soft-skills picked up by volunteering. We aim to protect the rights of our students by working closely with the relevant authorities, collecting and distributing feedback, and raising awareness.</p>		
<p><b>Main fields covered</b></p>	<p>We offer a large spectrum of projects that focus on career and self-development.</p> <p>Our proudest achievement, in terms of student collaboration, is the "Law Motorway", a joint initiative of eight Law Students' Organisations from seven cities in Romania and Moldova, where a number of students participate in a week-long exchange programme in another city, full of academic and social activities. We have already reached the 18th edition, meaning that more than 350 students have experienced being a law student in Cluj-Napoca.</p> <p>Furthermore, OSD is divided into six Departments, each of which has a particular type of activities:</p> <p>Academic - focused on "formal events", such as Conferences, Law quizzes, Moot Court competitions etc.</p> <p>External Relations - focused on "informal events", e.g. trivia quiz with academic staff, Law Motorway and events organised by our partners</p> <p>Marketing - creates the image of the Organisation, and also promotes mental wellbeing with #sesifărăstresi, a project meant to encourage our students during the exam period</p> <p>Finance - manages fundraising and financing, as well as the OSD &amp; CSFD Awards, when we reward graduates that helped their local communities</p> <p>Human Resources - handles the motivation, management and recruitment of our volunteers; specialised in fun and engaging events</p> <p>Legal Internships - covers the need for internships, and also helps with trainings for our volunteers</p>		
<p><b>Proposed cooperation areas</b></p>	<p>Although our focus is on other Law organisations, we are open to collaborate with people in any field of study. The beauty of Law is that it is present in every part of our lives, and so hybrid projects can easily be implemented. Thus far, collaboration with history, psychology and medical students have gathered a lot of positive feedback, so we are always open to try new joint approaches to aspects of law.</p>

<p><b>Short presentation</b></p>	<p>The Student Council of Babeş-Bolyai University is the sole representative structure for students at UBB, actively involved in the university's decision-making bodies. The Council's purpose is to represent and defend the rights and interests of the university's students, contribute to the development of the university's academic community, promote multiculturalism, and academic values. The main objectives of the Council are to maintain and promote transparent and open communication with students, faculty, decision-making bodies, and administrative bodies; establish a system for identifying and consulting on students' expectations, needs, initiatives, and proposals; identify and implement optimal solutions for students' problems and other areas of interest. CSUBB's vision is that the student is the main active factor in ensuring both the quality of Romanian education and its alignment with European and international standards.</p> <p>Within CSUBB, there are 28 student senators and 22 student chancellors, forming the CSUBB plenary. Additionally, there is an Extended CSUBB composed of all 132 student counselors. The areas of interest range from student representation to aspects of student life such as mental health, youth welfare, civic engagement, and issues that directly or indirectly affect young people. The CSUBB plenary meets at least once a month in plenary sessions, but there are also other more frequent meetings with various working teams, such as the design and PR team, the student policy team, or the human resources team.</p>		
<p><b>Main fields covered</b></p>	<p>Our main interest lies in student representation, campus life, students' physical and mental well-being, as well as civic engagement.</p>		
<p><b>Proposed cooperation areas</b></p>	<p>Awareness events and campaigns for mental health: By collaborating with organizations that focus on mental health, we can organize events, workshops, and awareness campaigns to reduce the stigma associated with mental health issues and to provide resources and support to affected students.</p> <p>Physical activity and sports initiatives: Partnering with organizations that promote physical activity and sports to offer more options and opportunities for student engagement in various sports and recreational activities.</p> <p>Leadership and communication skills development: Collaborating with organizations that offer programs for developing leadership, communication, and conflict resolution skills to support students in their personal and professional development.</p> <p>Civic engagement and volunteering: Working with organizations that promote civic engagement and volunteering to provide students with opportunities to get involved in the community and contribute to positive changes in society.</p> <p>Intercultural projects and exchange experiences: Working together with organizations that promote diversity and intercultural understanding, we can organize projects and events to encourage exchange experiences and increase understanding and tolerance among students from different cultural backgrounds.</p>

### Short presentation

The Student Organisation of the „Babeş-Bolyai” University was founded on the 24th of March 1997. OSUBB advocates for the defense of democratic values, human rights, freedom of expression, as well as the right to uphold one's own principles and opinions through democratic means. We support the legitimate representation of students, based on the objective evaluation of students' real needs, and the promotion of authentic values in academic society, including in the case of student representatives. We support the importance of student involvement as equal partners in the decision-making process, at any level where the student is a direct beneficiary. Moreover, we do not associate ourselves with any ideology or party politics, maintaining a neutral and responsible attitude, supporting the right of any individual to their own ideological or political choices, without affecting the image, means of action, and activities of OSUBB. Furthermore, our purpose is representation of all students at „Babeş-Bolyai” University, regardless of gender, nationality, religion, sexual orientation, political preference, or economic status, in relation to all decision-making structures that impact students at „Babeş-Bolyai” University, through specific means and objectives:

- Actions with a social, union, educational, and youth-oriented character;
- Participation in improving the quality of education at „Babeş-Bolyai” University through competent representatives;
- Organization of student protests in case of law violations or the interests of the university community, and, in justified cases, declaration of strikes;
- Promotion and representation of students' interests at the Faculty, University, local, national, and international levels;
- Support for „Babeş-Bolyai” University students in developing skills necessary for the job market and integration into professional life;
- Promotion of collaborative relationships with all similar organizations nationally and internationally;
- Possibility of joining and actively participating as a member in certain local, national, or international organizations/federations whose goals and activities do not contradict the purpose, objectives, and principles stipulated;
- Implementation and support of socio-professional projects and leisure activities for students and young people aged 14 to 35;
- Identification, through consultations, of specific problems facing students at „Babeş-Bolyai” University and involvement of both OSUBB and students in their resolution;
- Provision of training, improvement, and specialization programs and internships to organization members;
- Promotion and organization of multicultural activities to strengthen interethnic relations;
- Organization of projects and events to promote a healthy lifestyle among students through sports, nutrition, and health education;
- Promotion and organization of events regarding the importance of responsible behavior towards the environment;
- Involvement in the consultation and decision-making process in the Cluj community, which impacts the university environment;
- Promotion of inclusion and equal opportunities at UBB and within the Cluj community.

<p><b>Short presentation</b></p>	<p>The Hungarian Students' Union of Cluj (HSUC) is an advocacy, interest protection and cultural organisation of all the Hungarian students of higher education institutions in Cluj-Napoca, operating since 1990. HSUC is an independent, non-profit and apolitical civil association with legal personality. Its activities are based on the voluntary work of its members. Its main objectives are to support the establishment and operation of an independent Hungarian-language higher education system, to represent and protect the interests of students (aprox. 12.000 Hungarian students), to help Hungarian students in their professional training and career development, and to support their professional activities; to establish and maintain contacts with Hungarian and foreign youth and student organisations. It contributes to meeting the cultural needs of Hungarian students and provides opportunities for social and other scholarships.</p> <p>The association is open to all study levels and independent from any institution. However, our organization has 17 different departments. Departments are small student associations that operate within the faculties of the universities. They provide both fun and professional activities throughout the year to make the grey university life more colourful. The special feature of the departments is that they bring together Hungarian students from different faculties and universities, bringing together students with the same interests who want to have fun and develop their skills.</p>		
<p><b>Main fields covered</b></p>	<p>One of the most important tasks of the Hungarian Students' Union of Cluj is to protect the interests of Hungarian students in Cluj-Napoca, and therefore, according to the Statutes, the HSUC's Council must include a member who is responsible for educational issues. Currently, in practice, the legitimacy of student representation is given by the student representatives elected by the students, who represent them of the faculty's council or at the senat. As stated in the Statutes, the HSUC does not only represent students from faculties where Hungarian teaching is offered, so it is important to pay attention to Hungarian students studying at all the universities of Cluj-Napoca. The HSUC has 29 student representatives at the faculties, 7 student senators and 1 vice-prefect.</p> <p>Our office is located in the heart of Cluj-Napoca, which is a meeting point for the students, in addition to providing information for them.</p> <p>The Hungarian Students' Union of Cluj organizes about 17 major events of its own every year, the two largest of which are the Transylvanian Scientific Students' Conference and the HSUC Student Days. Our events include a series of freshmens' programmes aimed at students new to Cluj-Napoca, but also offer fun and development opportunities for students of all ages.</p> <p>In addition to its own events, HSUC also helps as a partner organisation in many other events and programmes in Cluj.</p> <p>The Hungarian Students' Union of Cluj has a wide range of services aimed at meeting the various needs of students and offering solutions to their problems. These services are: the A Card (our own student card), the HSUC Sports Office, and the HSUC Career Office.</p>		
<p><b>Proposed cooperation areas</b></p>	<p>Our aim is to show the other student organisations of Eutopia that there is a strong multicultural community in Romania, whose Hungarian student life is also greatly influenced by the HSUC, being the biggest Hungarian student organization of Romania. We would be happy to meet other student organisations that also provide opportunities for the minorities.</p>

<p><b>Short presentation</b></p>	<p>The Council of Students of the Faculty of Sociology and Social Work is an organization consisting of 8 members, with a structure that includes 2 senators for the Romanian and Hungarian line, one chancellor and five councillors, and, each one representing a constituency of the faculty. We are guided by the values of inclusion, representation of students and promotion of their interests within our faculty.</p> <p>We have occasional meetings, but we are always available to listen to and represent the needs and concerns of our students. We have a strong commitment to organise activities that reflect the diversity and concerns of students in the field of sociology and social work.</p> <p>One of our recent projects, carried out in January, was "FSAS Rise", which had the central theme of student representation. This project involved various activities such as debates and workshops meant to highlight the voice and perspectives of our students.</p>		
<p><b>Main fields covered</b></p>	<p>The sub-domains and topics addressed by our organization may include: 1) Student Rights: Monitoring compliance with student rights, including the right to education, freedom of expression and access to appropriate resources and services, 2) Academic Development: Supporting initiatives that promote quality education and supporting students in achieving their academic goals, 3) Social Good: Engage in projects and events that address social and community issues, as well as promote solidarity and inclusion on campus and in the local community, 4) Student Participation: Facilitating student participation in decision-making processes within the faculty and promoting their involvement in academic and extracurricular life.</p>		

<b>Proposed cooperation areas</b>	<p>Exchange of good practices: We may organise exchange sessions and best practices between our organisations to learn from each other how to represent more effectively the interests of our students and to promote their rights.</p> <p>Joint campaigns and actions: We can work together in organising joint campaigns and actions to raise awareness and bring to the public attention various issues related to student rights, including issues of discrimination, and, access to education and other social concerns.</p> <p>Academic and cultural events: We may organise joint academic and cultural events, such as conferences, workshops or festivals, which address topics relevant to our areas of interest, such as sociology and social work.</p>

Fall 2024's have been writers Jennifer Guerra and Donatella Lanzarotta, who have presented their respective books and held an open-floor discussion on sex and body positivity, as well as professor Nadia Maria Filippini, who has presented and discussed with all present her own book about the 1976 Verona rape trial which led to widespread feminist protests in Italy. A well-attended feminist journalistic writing workshops – offered as an internship opportunity for a selection of university departments – was held online in 2022-2023 in collaboration with feminist freelance journalists Stefania Prandi, Cristiana Bedei, Marie Moïse and Silvia Nugara. The Fall 2023 edition was carried out in the same way with Stefania Prandi, Cristiana Bedei and Marie Moïse, and the Spring 2024's is currently being finalized.</p> <p>In Fall 2024 a feminist film club, preceded and bookended by an open-discussion "lecture" on feminist-lens cinematography and cinematic critique held by Eugenia Fattori, herself a film critic, writer and activist. The cineforum was held at the Date cinema in Mestre for four nights. The Spring 2024 edition will take place between May and June. The association also does its best to take part as many in feminism-related events in the Venice area as possible even outside the university context, often collaborating with the Mestre branch of the Non Una Di Meno trans-feminist organization. We were also invited to hold a workshop at the TEDx event "Identità e stereotipi di genere" (gender identity and stereotypes) held in Mestre on Nov. 19th 2023. The Feminist Bookclub was hosted online throughout most of the 2020-2021 academic year. The 2021-2022 edition has been held in a blended mode, with in-person meetings hosted in collaboration with the independent bookshop Il Giralibri in Mestre – which offered its events space for this purpose – and simultaneous Zoom connection for those unable to physically attend. The 2022-2023 edition was hosted mostly in person the common spaces of the Mestre hostel Anda, with the possibility of joining on Zoom as well. Most of our meeting (usually at least twice a month) are held online, as our members are spread out throughout the Veneto region area and beyond, but we try to meet each other in person whenever possible. Initially operated by the Faculty of Law, the RLCD is now part of TU Dresden's Center for International Studies. The RLCD offers free legal advice at four locations in Dresden and online, reaching over 300 people every year. The aim is to create low-threshold access to legal advice and thus provide refugees with support in our bureaucratic legal system, regardless of their assets or language skills. The students participating undergo a one-year training course at the TU Dresden. (One-semester lecture with exercise, legal exam, one-semester colloquium, four-week internship, oral exam). Previous knowledge is not necessary, the course is open to all students who are willing to provide voluntary legal advice afterwards. Counseling is then provided in teams of two, accompanied by supervision. The students are not only involved in counseling, but are also part of the RLC network, where they receive further training and connect through monthly workshops and exchange meetings.</p> <p>The RLCD also participates in events of all kinds, maintains a constant dialog with its cooperation partners and writes blog posts on asylum and residence law issues. In addition, the RLCD frequently holds meetings with members of the Bundestag, to whom current projects and issues are presented. The RLCD is coordinated by a project manager and student assistants.
