

EUTOPIA virtual simulation exercise on the European Media Freedom Act

- **WHEN?** 10-11 February 2025
- **WHERE?** Online. Access will be provided to a dedicated VUB Canvas course.
- **WHAT?** Simulation exercise on intra and inter-institutional negotiations of European Media Freedom Act. Note that the simulation will take place in English. Sufficient command of English is required.
- **WHY?** Puts theory of EU policy-making into practice, allowing students to gain firsthand experience of EU institutional negotiations, rules and strategies! Students will receive an EUTOPIA certificate of participation and micro-credentials upon completing the simulation exercise.
- **COST?** Free. Vrije Universiteit Brussel will cover the cost of participation and organisation.
