in Michael Scott | Warwick Institute of Engagement



Michael Scott is the Academic Director of the Warwick Institute of Engagement, a Professor in the Department of Classics and Ancient History at Warwick and an Honorary Citizen of Delphi, Greece. He is a National Teaching Fellow and Principal Fellow of Advance HE, and believes passionately in making the ancient world as accessible as possible, acting as Director and Trustee of Classics for All, and as President of the largest regional branch of the UK Classics Association. He regularly talks in schools around the country, writes articles for national and international newspapers and magazines, participates in BBC radio shows and

podcasts, and facilitates engagement with the ancient world via a suite of social media channels. He is the author of several successful popular history books, and has written and presented over a dozen TV series about the ancient world for History Channel, National Geographic, BBC and ITV. Sophie Staniszewska leads the Patient and Public Involvement and Engagement (PPIE) and Experiences of Care Research Programme at Warwick Medical School, UK. She undertakes studies exploring the patient and public experiences of health care and is developing the concept of patient-based evidence. She is also developing the evidence base of PPIE in areas such as mathematical and economic modelling, genomics and enabling data and gastrointestinal infection.





Lucija Ažman Momirski | University of Ljubljana



Lucija Ažman Momirski holds the position of associated professor of urban design since 2010 at the University of Ljubljana Faculty of Architecture (UL FA). She served as Vice Dean of science and research at the UL FA from 2005 to 2007 as well as the Chair for technology, computer design, and (urban) management from 2012 to 2018, has been a visiting professor at the TU Delft and University of Zagreb, a visiting assistant professor at the Graz University of Technology and has taught in Italy, Germany, Spain, Liechtenstein, Turkey, and Bosnia and Herzegovina. In addition to her teaching,

she has received several first prizes and awards in national and international architectural and urban design competitions, led a number of international research and professional projects, published articles, books and chapters in Slovenia and abroad, and edited several publications.

Carina Veeckman is a senior researcher at SMIT since 2011 (BA & Ms Communication Sciences). Carina has been working on several European-funded projects on citizen science, both as a project manager and researcher.
