
### STUDENTS: THE AXIS OF THE PROJECT

# **Open Innovation Challenge TIMELINE**




## **EUTOPIA OPEN INNOVATION CHALLENGE SUBJECT**

# Stage 2. Open innovation process searching for innovative solutions on the basis of two selected challenges. March 2021- June 2022.

- 6 teams per university (of six students each one): 36 teams!
- weDISCOVER week in BXL, March/April 2021. 6 students per university (one student per team -> Launch of the Eutopia Innovation Challenge.
- Hackathon in Gothenburg, October 21. Six teams of six students (one per university)
- Final round in WU, June 2022. 3 teams of six students each one.

Stage 3. Prize and opportunities for the winning solution, beyond the pilot. From June 22 to the end of the Pilot (and beyond).

#### **Project Management** course (5 ECTS, first term) (Stage 1)

#### Glocal Challenges course (5 ECTS, third term) (Stage 2)

- 40 students working in multidisc. teams of 6
- +PM and leadership skills
- Glocal challenges is a course addressed to students in the last two years of any degree that faces <u>how to solve local challenges with an international mindset following a project-based methodology</u>. The starting point will be two challenges selected by the EUTOPIA alliance that will demand creative solutions from the students working in multidisciplinary teams. Each project team will compete to solve one of the proposed challenges in a contest to participate in the annual contest of Glocal Challenges led by EUTOPIA.





During the WeDiscover Days Barcelona, Universitat Pompeu Fabra will organize several activities as students can approach the challenges from a multidisciplinary and holistic way.

### Objectives:

#### **ENCOURAGE**

Encourage a first contact between students and professors that come from the EUTOPIA universities

#### **INVOLVE**

Involve UPF researchers, professors, students and alumni who, from different perspectives and disciplines, will offer their extensive knowledge of the different Eutopia challenges.

#### **CHALLENGE**

Take a first approach to the Eutopia challenges.

#### INVITE

Invite specialists from research centers, companies, cultural world, politics, etc who can provide the project with complementary views working together with our stakeholders.



# Types of activities to schedule during the WeDiscover Days BCN:



We will divide activities in 3 blocks:

- 1. Presentations by researchers and specialists from EUTOPIA
- 1. Tours organized by our stakeholders (Barcelona City Council, 22 @ Network BCN and Incasol) to companies and start-ups linked to one of our challenges.
- 1. Activities, workshops, shows and colloquia with several formats, responding to the need of disseminating, reflecting, solving and putting a critical sense on the current global concerns.

## AFTERNOON: PRESENTATIONS, TALKS & DEBATES
